

COORDINATED DECISION

of Hungarian Energy and Public Utility Regulatory Authority (HEA) and Romanian Regulatory Authority for Energy (ANRE) on cross-border cost allocation request jointly submitted by

- **FGSZ - Földgázszállító Zártkörűen Működő Részvénytársaság** (Hungary) for project of common interest (PCI) no. 6.13 – Cluster Romania-Hungary-Austria transmission corridor and PCI project no. 6.14 Romanian-Hungarian reverse flow at Csanadpalota or Algyo, both plans developed on Hungarian territory,

and

- **S.N.T.G.N TRANSGAZ S.A.** for project of common interest (PCI) no. 7.1.5 – Gas pipeline from Bulgaria to Austria via Romania and Hungary – The development of the Romanian Gas Transmission System along the Bulgaria-Romania-Hungary-Austria route, developed on Romanian territory.

The cross-border cost allocation (CBCA) request was received by both national regulatory authorities (hereafter cited as NRA's) and was transmitted for information to the Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (ACER), as per Article 12 (3) of Regulation (EU) No 347/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 April 2013 on guidelines for trans-European energy infrastructure and repealing Decision No 1364/2006/EC and amending Regulations (EC) No 713/2009, (EC) No 714/2009 and (EC) No 715/2009 (hereafter cited as Regulation).

Having:

- evaluated the contents of the cross-border cost allocation request;
- received all further information requested from project promoters;
- exchanged necessary information between NRA's regarding the CBCA request,

HEA and ANRE have concluded their consideration of the CBCA request and have agreed that no costs will be allocated between project promoters and each project promoter will individually bear only the costs generated by the development of the project in their hosted country.

Attached to this decision are detailed reasons for NRA's decision in respect of this CBCA request, as required by Article 12 (5) of the Regulation.
